This reform relies mainly on a re-insertion policy (*Revenu Minimum d'Insértion*; <u>RMI</u>), which is <u>a</u> non-contributory means-tested scheme <u>that</u>.-It guarantees a <u>least-minimum</u> level of resources. In order t<u>T</u> o be eligible for this scheme, a non-French <u>resident</u> has to be in the possession of a *carte de séjour* and has to have lived in France for five years. An unemployed North_-African <u>resident who is</u> not eligible for <u>a</u>-unemployment benefits is therefore eligible for the RMI, which is of €-460 a month (Rmi Fr. 2010). He <u>They is are</u> also eligible for housing benefits and health protection. <u>He/She isThey are</u> exonerated from paying council tax and <u>he/she</u> can also be eligible for <u>phone-bill</u> reduction of the phone bill.
